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WORKPLACE LEARNING COORDINATORS

The program identifies, facilitates and coordinates industry specific learning opportunities for young people and connects industry and schools to provide the opportunity for students to experience quality workplace learning.













WORKPLACE LEARNING COORDINATORS

ON BEHALF OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT, YOUTH CONNECT'S WORKPLACE LEARNING COORDINATORS (WLC) HELP STUDENTS AGED 15-19 ENROLLED IN SECONDARY SCHOOL, TAFE OR A COMMUNITY EDUCATION PROVIDER IN THE BAYSIDE, GLEN EIRA AND KINGSTON AREA FIND OUALITY WORKPLACE LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES.

Workplace Learning is any opportunity where a young person enters the workplace and utilises workplace skills and learns more about careers that they may wish to pursue in the future.

THIS CAN INCLUDE:

Work Experience - A student visits a business for approximately a week run throughout the year to observe the different aspects of work. During the work experience the student may assist with allocated tasks.

Structured Workplace Learning (SWL)* - Students undertaking Vocational Education and Training (VET)* undergo work placement to practice the industry specific skills they have learned and developed.

School Based Apprenticeship & Traineeship (SBAT) -

Students have the opportunity to earn and learn, undertaking paid work at trainee wage while completing their studies and VET training. When an SBAT program is successfully completed, students gain a nationally recognised qualification as well as their senior school certificate and the possibility of ongoing employment.

Practical Placement - Flexible work placement for students undertaking their Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning (VCAL)* Certificate including a VET subject.

***VCAL:** Similar to the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) is a recognised senior school qualification. The flexibility of VCAL enables students to design a study program that suits their interests and learning needs.

***VET:** Enables a student to undertake accredited certificate training (ie. Certificate II Hospitality, Certificate III Retail etc.) to gain occupational and work-related knowledge and skills.
