# Career and Transition Programs 2013



iPrep provides young people with the opportunity to have a mock interview with a Youth Connect corporate or community volunteer, providing them with a real interview experience. Students will experience the process, and function of a job interview and receive valuable feedback from their interviewer to complete this experimental learning.

In 2012, iPrep has been delivered in eight schools and community settings which has involved over 680 students. The students have ranged from years 9-12, either in a VCAL or VCE program and TAFE students. The program is proving itself ideal for targeting a niche as the school requires.





An Industry Tour is a valuable experience for students. It will provide them with an opportunity to take a tour of a workplace and training facility within a specific industry area, hear from industry specialists and gain a better understanding of further education and employment opportunities within the industry.

Themed industry tours include; Automotive, Fashion, Finance, Horticulture, Hospitality, I.T., Sport & Recreation, Manufacturing and Transport & Logistics.

In 2012, over 485 young people have participated in a STEPs program.



A career exploration program for young people allowing them to look at different career pathways and to obtain work readiness training in preparation for further education, training and employment.

Industry Xplorer can be tailored to meet student needs and is generally delivered 2-3 hours per week over six to nine weeks.

Program workshop topics as part of the *IndustryXplorer* program may include Resume Writing workshop/s, Letter of Application & Online Application process, Dress for Success, Workplace Etiquette, Interview skills, PLUS each student will participate in the *iPREP* – Mock Interview Program, concluding with a student expo and graduation.

Secondary School Conversation Facilitator Training will be launched with training on the 3 & 4 December at Youth Connect.



The Applied Learning Awards recognise the outstanding efforts of students undertaking the Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning (VCAL), VET in Schools (VETiS) certificates and School Based Apprenticeships and Traineeships (SBATs).

This year's Awards Ceremony, held on the October 16 at the International of Brighton, saw over 300 attendees witness 36 Awards and 51 Nomination Certificates presented to secondary students, teachers, employers, secondary schools and training organisations.

Students, teachers, schools and employers were winners in the fourth year of the Bayside Glen Eira Kingston Applied Learning Awards. Berendale School received the '2012 Regional Champion School Award' and Brighton Honda the '2012 Regional Champion Employer Award'. Both were recognised for contributing most in terms of applied learning (sometimes referred to as vocational learning) for our community's young people. The 'Applied Learning Student of the Year' award was also launched for the first time this year and presented to Natasha Lema from Our Lady of the Sacred Heart.

The Applied Learning Awards recognise those that make applied learning possible such as the secondary schools that offer applied learning programs; the teachers who support and train students; and, the businesses that provide students with workplace experience and mentoring.

Schools are not required to offer applied learning programs, but those that do often see student, community and business opportunities resulting. Danny Schwarz, Chief Executive Officer of Youth Connect, said that all applied learning providers should be just as valid as those offering academic learning. "There isn't a right or wrong approach, as long as the young person is succeeding and enjoying what they are doing," he said.

The 100 Job Opportunities for Youth in 22 Days campaign successfully ne helped boost youth employment and address the skills shortage in the Kingston, Bayside and Glen Eira areas.

Three Job Hubs were set up in the City of Kingston to provide young people aged 16-25 with the opportunity to apply for positions listed within local businesses, write CV's and prepare for interviews.

Over 22 days, the campaign collaboratively identified employer needs, prospective employee expectations while, fostering a mutual respect

to support young people in securing employment.

This Youth Job campaign was proudly supported and facilitated by Youth Connect, Bayside Kingston Glen Eira Local Learning and Employment Network (BGK LLEN) and the City of Kingston.

The 100/22 campaign successfully enhanced the job opportunities available to young people in the local area and is set to return next year.
