iPrep Mock Interview Program

Prepare your students to talk to employers in a formal interview, help them prepare for their casual mid-year job application as well as organising their work experience.

Interviews are conducted in a formalised manner by trained industry personnel.

Lil Stapleton, - Figurehead Hairdressing

In early 2012 the Youth Connect Workplace Learning Coordinator (WLC) team contacted Figureheads Hairdressing in Martin Street to touch base with a long term supporter. Salon owner Lil Stapleton had previously hosted students for work experience and had been looking for a way to incorporate young people into her workplace. The WLC team suggested considering a School Based Apprenticeship, or "SBAT" - a part-time option for school students to undertake 1-2 days of trainee work per week to gain familiarity and try out an industry before committing to a full-time position or apprenticeship.

SBATs are a great option for students as they enable young people to gain a vocational and technical qualification while completing their school studies, giving them a head start with work, and an opportunity to 'earn and learn'.

The WLC team identified a local student, Jessica who was passionate about working in the industry and had been contemplating leaving her studies take up a full-time hairdressing apprenticeship. Jessica proved to be an excellent fit at Figureheads and after one year, she has successfully completed both her SBAT and her studies at Our Lady Sacred Heart. Jess was nominated for a 2012 Australian Vocational Student Prize and Lil has taken her on as a full-time apprentice. School Based Apprenticeships are available in a wide variety of industries and are linked to some excellent vocational outcomes, as well as financial incentives for employers. Interview with School Based Apprenticeship student Jess Simonet:

What is your favourite part of the work you do?

I really enjoy colouring all the clients' hair. I interact with the customers as I am washing their hair, blow drying their hair, there is lots of communication.

What have you found challenging about the role?

When I first started I wasn't very good with washing hair and blow waving. Since starting the SBAT I have improved overall and in all the aspects I am much better at what I do.

What do you think you might have done if you hadn't got into an SBAT with Figureheads?

I have no idea what I would have done ...I probably would have dropped out of school and done a full time apprenticeship.

Would you recommend to other students to try out an SBAT?

I would. I recommend going in for a few days and seeing if you actually like doing the job because it is terrible if you start and half way through you change your mind. I came in for a few days to Figureheads so Lil could find out if I was suitable and I worked another few days to find out if it was something I wanted to do.

RMEP Work Readiness Workshops at DHS Sunshine and Dandenong

Youth Connects Refugee Minor Employment Program (RMEP) Case Managers Rebecca Thorn and Andreas Panagiotopoulos, together with Career Transition Programs Coordinator Mary Licciardo, delivered three successful work readiness workshops to staff at the Department of Human Services (DHS) in Sunshine and Dandenong.

The DHS staff members were Case Managers in the Refugee Minor Program (RMP) and the workshops were designed to facilitate discussions around how to ascertain when clients are 'job ready' and how best to support clients collaboratively in their search for work.

The workshops fostered positive discussion and enabled Youth Connect and DHS to identify potential barriers and ways in which these can be best addressed. In total there were approximately 35 staff who attended the workshops which included Program Team Leaders and Youth Connect CEO, Danny Schwarz.

Mary Licciardo delivered a condensed version of the Career and Transition Support (CATS) program, which provided Case Managers with easy to understand and practical tools to help them support their clients in navigating their way through the education and vocation system in Victoria.

Youth Connect received positive feedback from DHS, with most staff concluding that the workshops were beneficial, relevant and practical.

Youth Connect would like to thank DHS for providing them with the opportunity to present these workshops designed to greater strengthen the relationship between both organisations.

Workshop 2 - Confidence building/Motivation

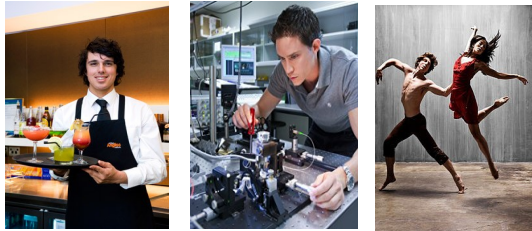
